GATE PROGRAMS

GATE Cluster All 3rd-5th grade classrooms are Cluster classrooms

 Comprised of approximately 25%+ GATE students plus students who represent the school population

GATE Seminar

- One Seminar class per grade level
- GATE Seminar qualified students, plus next highest scoring students
- Accelerated program, increased rigor, project-based, extensions
- Must submit "intent to enroll" form in the spring
- Siblings from other schools may enroll if space is available
- * additional informational meeting in the spring

ABOUT THE TEST

- CogAt a test of thinking/reasoning skills that consists of verbal analogies, mathematics analogies, and matrices
- Administered online
- Given in a group context
- Normative scoring based on the student's age
- Practicing invalidates test scores

WHO GETS TESTED

- 2nd Grade: All students
- 3rd-5th Grade: Students who are new to the district
- 5th Grade Retest
 - Recommended that students meet retest criteria
 - ? Above Standard scores on state testing in all areas
 - ? Cluster: previous score in 85th percentile
 - ? Seminar: previous GATE identification (score of 121)
 - Students are only allowed one retest and are only retested in 5th grade

Testing will take place in January/February

*Note: No testing beyond 5th grade - middle schools and high schools use performance data for students who are new to the district

SCORING: MULTI-CRITERION MATRIX

- CogAt score is used as the base
- •Qualifying Scores:
 - Cluster 121
 - Seminar 135
- Additional points for factors:
 - English Learner status (5)
 - Low Socioeconomic Status (5)
 - Above standards on all areas state testing (2)
 - Exceeding standards on 10/11 areas on report card (2)
 - Disability IEP or 504 Plan (2)
 - Relocation 3+ school moves in Elementary or military (1)
 - Having 3+ factors (2)

MHAT DO I TELL MY CHILDS

- The test provides teachers and parents with information about how the child thinks
- Parents can decide whether to share test results with their children
- It's important that students know that their scores are private and should not be shared with others - issues arise when children share scores, as it can make others feel "less than"

APPEALS & CONCERNS

- Parent concerns/questions about retesting, make-ups, changing identification, programs, choice schools, and existing criteria are all handled by the school site GATE Committee
- ALL issues/complaints/decisions are dealt with at the school site level through our GATE Committee
- Appeals can be made for a retest only; there is not an appeal process for the Seminar program
- Retests are administered in the next testing window, which is the following year

District Advisory Committee (DAC) for GATE

- An important vehicle for parent and community involvement in educational programs for gifted students
- Comprised of parent representatives from schools throughout the district
- Is designed to represent all geographical areas of the district as well as the GATE programs and the grade levels in which they are offered
- Opens communications between district administrators, local schools, and parents in innovative ways that fit each school's individual needs
- Can provide constructive feedback from parents to stimulate continued growth in the GATE program
- GATE DAC representatives work with schools and GATE Team Leaders to coordinate efforts on parent development to promote communication on GATE issues, and to enhance the school's GATE program
- Examples include: publishing newsletters; establishing business partnerships; coordinating parents and professional who have special expertise; assisting site planning committees; participating in gifted education conferences.
